CHANGES TO NATIONAL PARKS ORDER**

**National Parks Ordinance  
(Section 3 (4))**

*(Legal Notice of 2016)*

**MADE** by the Director of the Department of Environment and Costal Resources under section 3 (4) of the National Parks Ordinance.

*Cap. 10.01*

Section 3 (4) of the National Parks Ordinance (the Ordinance), provides that the Director of the Department of Environment and Costal Resources (the Department) shall by notice published in the Gazette identify the proposed establishment, alteration, variation or cessation of a national park, nature reserve, sanctuary, area of historic interest or critical habitat reserve.
